

Rollator/Standard Walker Required Documentation for Medicare/Insurance

Clinical Notes must have statements addressing the following:

1. The beneficiary has a mobility limitation that significantly impairs his/her ability to participate in one or more mobility related activities of daily living (MRADL) <u>IN THE HOME</u>.

A mobility limitation is on that:

- a. Prevents the beneficiary from accomplishing the MRADL entirely; or
- b. Places the beneficiary at reasonably determined heightened risk of morbidity or mortality secondary to the attempts to perform the MRADL; or
- c. Prevents the beneficiary from completing the MRADL within a reasonable time frame; and
- 2. The beneficiary is able to safely use the walker; and
- 3. The functional mobility deficit can be sufficiently resolved with use of a walker.

Examples of MRADLs are: toileting, preparing meals, grooming. At least one example must be listed within the clinical notes.
